ELEVATION OF FLOOD-PRONE STRUCTURES
VILLAGE OF BABYLON, SUFFOLK COUNTY, N.Y.

Notification is hereby given to the public that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is reviewing a grant application for Hazard Mitigation Assistance funding from the Village of Babylon, Suffolk County, New York.

The grant application seeks Federal funding for 75% of the cost of elevating three residential structures above the base flood elevation. The subject properties are located within the base, or one percent chance floodplain (also known as the 100-year floodplain) of the Great South Bay and were substantially damaged by flood waters from Hurricane Irene in August 2011.

Federal Executive Orders 11988, Floodplain Management, and 11990, Protection of Wetlands, require federal agencies to review proposed actions in floodplains and/or wetlands and explore practicable alternatives to avoid, minimize or mitigate potential impacts.

A variety of alternatives were considered, including repairing/rebuilding to pre-flood condition, acquisition/demolition and acquisition/relocation. Rebuilding to pre-flood condition would not meet current code requirements. Acquisition/demolition and acquisition/relocation are not viable options due to the lack of vacant land and the desire to maintain an intact community. Elevating structures will reduce their vulnerability to future flood damages, lower flood insurance premiums, reduce repetitive flood claims, and bring dwellings into compliance with NFIP requirements. FEMA has determined that structure elevation is the most practicable alternative for the properties in question.
