A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR RALPH A. SCORDINO

Spring came early to Babylon Village this year due to the mild winter, the Greenhouse staff was able to plant colorful pansies earlier than usual in our planting containers throughout the Village. These splashes of color remind us that summer is on the way bringing warm weather activities.

The **Babylon Village Little League** officially kicked off our spring activities with its annual parade on April 21st. The **Historical Society's Ole Times Day** is coming up on May 20, and the **Village Memorial Day** parade, sponsored by American Legion Post 94, marches at 10:00 AM on May 28. The next weekend brings the Babylon Village **Chamber of Commerce's Sidewalk Sale**. The Village's **Swim and Recreation programs** begin at the end of the school year, providing activities all summer long (see page 5 for details). And, the ever-popular Tuna Tournament and Snapper Derby are scheduled for late July and August.

The Village's Highway Department has been hard at work over the past months. The falls at Argyle Park, which were showing signs of erosion from years of water flow, have been shored up, repaired and painted and a new playground was installed. Both of these projects were accomplished with funding from Suffolk County Legislator Wayne Horsley. Just in time for the beautiful spring weather, another playground installation has been completed on George Street which includes a dog run for public use. The roadway drainage project on Stowe Avenue and Tappan Avenue has been completed, and drainage improvement work has begun on Beverly Road with Marlborough Road and Bayview Avenue to follow. We also thank Senator Owen Johnson for spearheading the traffic redirection project on Litchfield Avenue and Route 109. We appreciate your patience as we conduct these necessary work projects to improve the roads throughout the Village.

Babylon Village is very fortunate to have a thriving business area with many unique shops and popular restaurants. The warm weather brings more people out and about on the streets and we urge drivers to please be alert to pedestrians in crosswalks. We also ask drivers to be cognizant of the speed limits through the downtown and residential areas and to obey all traffic signs. Look for new signage for our Municipal Parking lots.

On behalf of all of us at Village Hall, I wish you a safe and happy summer and hope you enjoy all the upcoming activities which have been planned by Village Hall and the many volunteer organizations in our community. Swim Lesson Sign-ups Start May 12

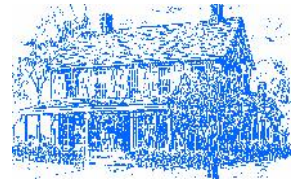
Family memberships are \$80, and season passes will list each family member residing at the same address. Individual memberships are \$50 for adults, \$30 for children, and \$10 for senior citizens (age 62 +). Two proofs of residency are required for all passes (e.g., driver's license, utility bill).

Late registration for all pool activities will be Saturday, June 9, from 9 AM - 12 PM, at the pool.

There is no mail registration.

2012 TAX RATE

Mayor **Ralph Scordino** reports the Village Board of Trustees has adopted a budget for the fiscal year starting June 1, 2012, that calls for a tax rate of \$12.98. This reflects a forty-eight cent increase per \$100 of assessed valuation of real estate property. This means that a home with a Village assessment of \$5,000 will have a Village tax increase of \$24 for this year.

Tax bills will be mailed by Friday, May 11. If you do not receive your bill and your mortgage company does not escrow for payment, call the Tax Receiver's office at 669-1500. If you recently purchased the property, please call the Tax Receiver's office as it takes a few months once the deed is recorded to receive the change of ownership from the County Clerk's office.

Taxes are due June 1, 2012. Check the legal notice in The BEACON or visit our website in the month of May for a more detailed explanation.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT UPDATE

The Babylon Village Highway Department is continuing with the installation of stormwater filter vaults throughout the Village. Along with the new vault installations, there has also been replacement of the contaminated filter media on an as-needed basis.

The Village has entered a contract with a testing laboratory to test the stormwater entering and exiting the filter vaults. This process is required by the funding source to confirm the proper filtering of the stormwater.

The ultimate goal of the Village is to install filter vaults on all of the 93 stormwater outfalls entering the surrounding water bodies.

AROUND VILLAGE HALL

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGE CLERK'S OFFICE

Landscapers. All landscapers working in Babylon Village must obtain a permit ANNUALLY to insure they are aware of Village rules and regulations. Applications are available at the Village Clerk's office and on our website. *Possession of a permit is NOT a recommendation by the Village as to the quality of the work a landscaper will perform.*

It is the responsibility of property owners to make sure any contractors you hire are properly insured. It is suggested you obtain a certificate of insurance showing coverage.



When you or your landscaping service use a broadcast spreader, please make sure no material is spread into any bodies of water. Also, all fertilizer should land on grass and garden areas not on sidewalks and streets where it will wash into drains. High levels of nitrogen, abundant in fertilizers, are harmful to aquatic life.

Crabbing permits are now due to be renewed and applications are available in the Village Clerk's office as well as on our website. The fee is \$5.00 for Babylon Village residents.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT NEWS

The Building Department reminds all Village residents of the following important regulations:

- Boat storage is not permitted on residential property after April 1st.
- Self locking gates and alarms are now mandatory for all pools in the Village of Babylon.
- **Pumping swimming pool water into streets or street drains is prohibited.**
- State code requires that carbon monoxide alarms be installed in all new and existing buildings. More information on this new code is available at www.dos.state.ny.us/CODE/COAlarm.htm.

TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

Babylon Village offers its residents a Street Tree Planting program. Residents are required to complete an application to request trees to be planted at the curb line in front of their homes. Applications are being accepted now through September 17 at Village Hall for the November 2012 planting. For further information call the Mayor's office at 669-1212.

S.T.O.P. SET FOR SEPTEMBER 22

The next S.T.O.P. (Stop Throwing Out Pollutants) date is Saturday, September 22, from 9 AM to 12 noon at the Village Sanitation Department. Residents may drop off acceptable household pollutants: latex and oil-based paints, car batteries, household cleaners, laundry products, used motor oil and other items. The Village will dispose of them properly.

Trustee Anthony Davida states that Babylon Village is proud to be a part of this important environmental program.

GENERAL SAFETY TIPS TO KEEP IN MIND

For the betterment of all, please keep the following points in mind:

- Circulars left in driveways are a clue for vandals and burglars that a house is empty. If you see these on a neighbors driveway or lawn when they are away, toss them out of sight.
- Please be watchful of strangers in your neighborhood. If you notice anyone suspicious walking around or driving slowly through your area, don't hesitate to call Suffolk County Police.
- Please make sure your house number is posted and visible from the street for police, fire and rescue personnel to find in the event of an emergency.



Please Watch Your Speed

With the warmer weather, more people are out and about. Please comply with speed limits set in our Village. The speed limit is 20 mph in school areas and 30 mph on ALL Village streets, unless otherwise posted.

NEWS FROM THE SANITATION DEPARTMENT



Please help us better serve you by noting the regulations below. If you have questions about these issues, please call the Village Sanitation Department at 669-4878.

- **Yard waste** (*leaves, plant clippings, - anything that grows*) should be separated from all other rubbish and placed in a clear plastic bag for a separate pick-up on your regular rubbish day. This is a mandate from the Town of Babylon which runs the landfills we use. There can be no plastic pots, plant tags, or other non-green contaminants in the bag with the yard waste or the bags will not be accepted and will be left at the curb.
- When putting out **metal objects** for pick-up, you must **call ahead** to advise the Sanitation Department that your item(s) will be out. These include refrigerators, washers, dryers, treadmills, BBQ grills.
- Place your rubbish between the sidewalk and the curb *not earlier* than 6 PM the evening before *nor later* than 7 AM on the morning of your collection day, and remove empty containers from the curb. **There is no garbage, rubbish or recycling pick-up on Saturdays, Sundays or holidays.** When rubbish or recycling collection falls on a holiday, please do not put items out for pick up until your regular scheduled rubbish/recycling day the following week.
- **Residents are responsible for any debris left in the street or at the curb by their landscaping companies.** Any leaves or other debris left behind, should be bagged by the resident and placed in your yard until your regular rubbish pick-up day.

Dog owners are reminded that the Village has installed two fenced-in dog runs: one is behind the south Little League ball field on Locust Avenue and the other is on George Street. Free doggie bags and disposal receptacle are provided. Owners are asked to please help keep the area clean by picking up after your animals and disposing of the waste properly.

VILLAGE POOL SUMMER PROGRAMS


- **Swimming instruction** is \$35 for children and \$40 for adults. A valid pool membership is required to register. Swim lessons run Monday, June 25, until August 3, with the annual Village Swim Meet on August 4.
- **ARC Junior Lifeguard Class and Instructor Aid Class.** Applicants must have completed all swim instruction levels.
- **Lifeguard Training Course** is offered for residents 15 and older who have completed all swim instruction levels.
- **Village Swim Team** is for residents with a valid pool membership. Age and height restrictions apply. There is a \$30 registration fee to join the Swim Team.
- **USCGA New York State Young Boater's Course** will be held at the pool for residents ages 10-18. Upon completion of the course, a boater's license will be issued to all attendees.

- Thursday, June 21**

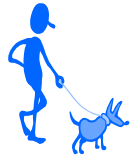
Offered this year are:
