A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR RALPH A. SCORDINO

As we continue to navigate together through this difficult time, I applaud our volunteer Fire Department, Rescue Squad and all our First Responders for the incredible and selfless aid they give to our community everyday and importantly, during the height of the pandemic. Many of us may not know, the Babylon Fire Department had many volunteers suffering from COVID-19. Some of our volunteers were hospitalized, on ventilators and still are recovering to this day. Yet, even with limited volunteers, our Fire Department, Rescue Squad and First Responders were there for our residents and community every step of the way. Heartfelt thanks to our Fire Chiefs, Volunteers and First Responders for their outstanding dedication to our community.

Many of our Village residents and families also continue to recover from COVID-19. Even though our COVID-19 case numbers in Babylon Village were not at a heightened amount as other communities, there are Village residents and families who were diagnosed with the virus, some extensively serious, with full recovery months away. May they have continued strength and progress each day towards a full recovery. For those who lost family and friends to this virus, our prayers for peace are with you.

Another definition of the word community in Babylon Village is the incredible response and exemplary work of Skip Gardner and our Highway and Maintenance, Sanitation, Parks and Code Enforcement crews for all their tireless efforts during and after Tropical Storm Isaias. Powerful winds took down many trees which left residents stranded in their homes, live wires were in the streets and there was a tremendous cleanup throughout the Village. Our crews were diligent and within a short period of time, we were back to “Babylon Village Beautiful.” Thank you for getting our residents through the storm, Skip Gardner, Scott Glenn, Jay Brunjes, Bill Whittier and crews. Your efforts in our Village everyday and during difficult times is what community is all about.

Another example of community in Babylon Village is our downtown business district. Our businesses, shops and restaurants are all working extremely hard to follow the guidelines set forth by the Governor’s office and to maintain business during this pandemic. Restaurants are able to have 50% indoor dining occupancy at this time and my office has been working with every business in our downtown to help them in their efforts to stay open, survive and hopefully have the ability to once again flourish, in the not too distant future. Please continue to support our downtown business district. Our merchants, business owners and restaurateurs are vital to our overall community value, so enjoy an evening or afternoon out in downtown Babylon Village!

Finally, I would be remiss in not thanking Trustee Mary Adams and Assistant Highway Superintendent Scott Glenn for keeping us all informed about changing protocols regarding COVID-19 and for making Village Hall and our business district safe for all of us.

As case numbers in our Village and throughout the State continue to remain low, I encourage all our Village residents and guests to continue to follow the guidelines and protocols from the Governor’s office: facial coverings, practice social distancing and repeatedly continue to sanitize your hands.

The Governor’s guidance has extended the suspension of open meetings in September. Although I had hoped that our Board meetings would resume in Village Hall, all Village of Babylon Board meetings, including the Zoning Board of Appeals, Planning Board meetings and Architectural Review Board meetings will continue to be held via Zoom until further guidance is received from the Governor’s

It was business as usual for our Village Highway Department as the Dalton Point shoreline project at the end of Araca Road were completed with NY Rising funding. Bulkheading and drainage was installed, which will help stabilize erosion as well as reduce the impact of flooding. One block over on Lighthouse Road, part of the street has been elevated and repaved, again with an aim to decrease the impact of flooding. All roads in the Argyle Lake area have been paved. The shoreline restoration of the north side of Argyle Lake continues. Work on Cedar Lane will improve drainage. On the north side of Montauk Highway, Tappan Avenue, Perrydale Court, Litchfield Avenue South and North Railroad Avenue was milled and resurfaced, as was Robert Street. Work is planned to raise East Shore Drive, resurface the road and add drainage and curbing. The municipal parking lot behind Gemelli’s has been repaved with new drainage and curbs and sidewalks and handicapped access was created with funding obtained from Senator Phil Boyle. Many thanks to Skip Gardner and his crew for all their efforts and hard work.

It is with great disappointment that I must announce that Kevin Muldowney, our Deputy Mayor, attended his final Board meeting last month. After much deliberation and discussion with the Village Trustees and myself about his intention to step down as a member of the Village Board of Trustees, Kevin has retired effective September 1st. After serving in one of the longest held Trustee positions in 31 years in Suffolk County, we can only congratulate him on his decision to step down and thank him for all his decades of service and dedication to the Village of Babylon.

Elected in 1989, Kevin's first area of responsibility was the conversion of our street lighting from mercury type lamps to low pressure sodium lamps, which were more efficient and economical. Under the administration of Mayor Don Conroy, Kevin selected and had installed the first group of old-fashioned street lights in our Village. 500 lamp posts later, they have become a Village landmark.

In the early nineties, he installed the first computer system in Village Hall, only to have to replace it due to the Y2K threat in 1999. He also replaced an antiquated telephone system with a new, state of the art digital network.

Kevin has also been responsible for the supervision of the opening and operation of the E. Donald Conroy Golf Course, another jewel in our Village. Opening the course was a dream of former Mayor Conroy and the result of much hard work by board members and a concerned resident committee, all who provided a tremendous amount of input and guidance during the planning stage of this project. As a result, the E. Donald Conroy Golf Course is one that is enjoyed by families, where tournaments are hosted and golf lessons are offered for all ages. It has become another added value in our Village for residents and guests and certainly our home values, as well. Kevin has also been tasked over the years with operation of 444 boat slips in our Village marinas and for maintaining those marinas for all boaters to enjoy, as well as ensuring the safety at each of them throughout the year.

On behalf of the Village of Babylon and our residents, I would like to personally thank Kevin's wife Diane and his daughters, Suzanne and Pamela. It was 31 years of service for Kevin; however, it was 31 years of sacrifice for Diane and her daughters. Thank you, Diane and family, for your support, encouragement and understanding and for being there every step of the way.

As we move forward, we will always appreciate Kevin's many contributions and efforts on behalf of our community. Pursuant to New York Village Law, Section 3-312..."vacancies in office caused other than by expiration of the terms thereof shall be filled by the Mayor, except the office of Mayor which shall be filled by the board of trustees, to the extend and periods of time set forth herein." As I had previously mentioned, Deputy Mayor Muldowney had told us he was considering retirement. With this in mind and after much consideration and discussion with the Village Board of Trustees, I am pleased to announce my appointment and welcome to the Village Board of Trustees, Dominic Bencivenga.

Dominic has been a resident of Babylon Village since 1995. He currently serves as the 3rd Vice President for the Babylon Lions Club, was co-founder of "Babylon Helps," an organization that provided community relief after Super Storm Sandy, volunteered with the Babylon Soccer Club, PTA Basketball, Little League and Softball, kid wrestling and youth football. Dom is a former committee chair for Cub Scout Pack 99 and very much involved with Boy Scout Troop #194.

Dominic served on the Babylon School Board of Education for nine years, was Board President from 2011-2013 and again in 2014. He served as Vice President of the school board, as well, from 2014-2015. Dominic is married to JoAnn and they have three children who attended the Babylon Public School System. Welcome, Dom, to the Village Board of Trustees and I look forward to working with you!

Trustee Robyn Silvestri is pleased to report the Conklin House was able to offer a diverse array of programs and events during the past summer months.

Free Documentary - On July 15th, the Conklin House hosted free, in-home screenings of the documentary *The Story of Plastics* and welcomed Mayor Ralph Scordino and Jay Brunjes, Head of Sanitation, for a discussion on recycling in the Village of Babylon. Jay shared with us best practices for effective recycling as residents who joined in on the Zoom video call asked insightful questions. POOL NEWS...

The 2020 pool season ended with the Village unable to open the Gilbert C. Hanse Municipal Pool due to COVID-19 concerns. However, Trustee Tony Davida reports the summer long closure did present an opportunity to make significant repairs and address maintenance concerns.

Masonry work and painting in both locker rooms were completed and benches in both rooms have been replaced with stained and varnished new wood. All plastic and aluminum partitions in the locker rooms have been removed with the intention of installing large storage lockers for chairs and umbrellas for residents.

All soffits and trim were scraped, primed and painted and all doors throughout the facility were cleaned and freshly painted. All air vents were replaced and the picnic area roof had new hurricane straps installed. The underside of that roof was scraped, primed and painted as were all exterior walls (except those with murals).

The kiddie pool now has a new overhead and foot shower with a cedar deck.

Thank you to the staff who all worked so hard during the summer to make your pool a better place for next year. Improvements will continue as long as the weather permits. I look forward to seeing everyone in the pool in 2021.


