## WELCOME TO SUMMER 2025, IN THE VILLAGE OF BABYLON!

From our marinas to our Gazebo concerts, our downtown block parties, terrific shopping and delicious dining, to our E. Donald Conroy Golf Course at Sumpwams Creek and our "Jewel on the Bay" ...THE happening place for our families and children...The Gilbert C. Hanse Municipal Village Pool on the Great South Bay! Our free Village summer recreation programs will begin soon for our children to enjoy, and as well, activities and events at our Historical Museum and the Conklin House.

Earlier in April, Newsday also featured a story on our wonderful community and all our amenities. The quaintness and charm, our deep sense of community, our home values, downtown and services that we all are proud of to have and enjoy are the components for The Village of Babylon being a sought after community to live, work and raise a family.

As I have often said, certainly in previous newsletters as well as in meetings and in discussions with residents, our main objective over these years has been our infrastructure. We have accomplished so much and still there is so much to do. Our Highway, Parks, Sanitation and Code Enforcement departments have seen an upgrade in vehicles and equipment. In our Fire Department, we have added an additional ambulance and equipment to keep our volunteer firemen and women safe. Sidewalks, roads and pavers in our downtown have been replaced, long awaited residential streets were repaved and right down to our white street posts which are diligently being worked on to be newly refreshed and repainted. There is so much our crews have completed and still so much to do as we work on improvements every day.

With change, of course, comes challenges. One important area of our infrastructure that is being addressed is our parking meter system in the downtown. The two-hour street meters in our downtown were always thought to provide for shopping retail while the 7 municipal lots were designed to be for extended parking, whether it be for dining, walking and of course, seeing a terrific show at The Argyle Theatre.

The street meters in the downtown have seen usage of extended long-term parking. This makes a detrimental situation for the retail shops which are vital to our community. Over the recent weeks, close to 50 or more street meters have been subjected to vandalism. Special thanks to Suffolk County

1<sup>st</sup> Precinct and Village Code Enforcement, the perpetrator has been apprehended. However, replacing those meters has become costly and only handles a two-hour time in the Village. The meters themselves are antiquated with parts taking longer to replace.

With this in mind, parking kiosks will become a new addition to replace our street meters. The kiosks will have up to 3 hours for street parking instead of 2 hours, can be paid either with cash, a credit card or the "tap" of your card for convenience.

In the Municipal Lot behind 72 E. Main Street/Bunger Surf Shop, parking kiosks will also be installed, and as well, the lot on S. Carll Avenue across from the Babylon Public Library. Some spaces will remain open for library patrons who wish to park there instead of the Babylon Library Parking lot.

Our Municipal Lots will all be equipped to handle extended hours that will accommodate theatre goers, dining experiences and spending time in the Village. Extending time can easily be done through a patron's cell phone and in the parking "app." Plenty of instruction will be provided on each kiosk.

As we see with the increases in the cost of living, I can assure you, our Village residents, that The Village Board, myself and all our Department Supervisors and Staff, our Superintendent of Public Works and Highway as well as our Treasurer are very focused and cost conscious every day on continuing with all the services we have in our Village and amenities we all enjoy.

Additional parking revenues will go into our continued roadwork and infrastructure plan. Looking in the near future, our Main Dock on Fire Island Avenue will be needing replacement and estimating costs approximately between \$5-\$6 million dollars. Grant funding is applied for whenever possible to offset costs.

As we change over our parking meter system, we will certainly keep our Village residents informed. I look forward to seeing all our Village residents at our downtown events, in restaurants, at the golf course, pool and of course, at our **Memorial Day Parade on Monday, May 26**th.

#### TAX INFORMATION 2025-2026:

Tax bills will be mailed on or about May 16th. If you do not receive your bill and your mortgage company does not escrow for payment, call The Tax Receiver's office at (631) 669-1500. If you recently purchased property, call the

Tax Receiver's office as it takes a few months once the deed is recorded to receive the change of ownership from the County Clerk's office. Taxes are due in full June 1, 2025. The last date taxes are payable without penalty is June 30, 2025. After that date, a 5% penalty will be added for the first month and an additional 1% for each month thereafter until paid. Additional fees will also accrue as of September 3, 2025. Check the legal notice in THE BEACON or visit our website in May for a more detailed explanation.

**LANDSCAPERS:** All landscapers working in Babylon Village must obtain a permit **ANNUALLY** to ensure they are aware of Village

rules and regulations. Applications are available at the Village Clerk's office and on our website. Possession of a permit is NOT a recommendation by the Village as to the quality of the work a landscaper will perform. It is the responsibility of property owners to make sure any contractors hired are properly insured. It is suggested you obtain a certificate of insurance showing coverage.

When you or your landscaping service use a broadcast spreader, please make sure no material is spread into any bodies of water. Also, all fertilizer should land on grass and garden areas not on sidewalks and streets where it will wash into drains. High levels of nitrogen, abundant in fertilizers, are harmful to aquatic life.

Per Village Code, Chapter 210, Section 210-7C, landscapers must not leave yard waste, debris, bags or containers at the curb for trash pickup. It must be carried away and disposed of by the landscaping company in accordance with federal, state and local law. Failure to comply with this section of the code may result in the landscaping permit being revoked.

#### **BUILDING DEPARTMENT NEWS**

As summer approaches so does pool season. Each year there are an average of 390 pool drownings in the USA, 78% are children under the age of 5. Please take a few minutes to ensure the following safety features are in place:



- Pool is enclosed with a minimum 4' high, non-climbable fence with self-closing/locking gates
- Any doors or windows that open within the enclosed area are equipped with alarms
- A surface alarm is in place and operational when pool is not being used
- Keep glass objects away from pool area
- · Never leave young children unattended

- ALL GARBAGE MUST BE TO THE CURB BY 7AM ON YOUR SCHEDULED PICKUP DAY!
- Village issued blue recycling cans are for GLASS, ALUMINUM and PLASTIC ONLY! No papers, cardboard or Styrofoam should be placed in the can.
- Newspapers should be tied or put in brown paper bags for the curb. Cardboard boxes should be flattened for the curb.
- Bagged leaves/plants/grass clippings must be in contractor bags or Village issued clear bags and weigh under 50lbs. Best rule of thumb, if you can lift it, they can too.
- Branches/limbs must be tied and cut to under 4ft.
- All rubbish (non-food) should be in contractor bags on curb, on scheduled garbage/rubbish day, as this is not for back door pick-up. No building/construction material-drywall, concrete, marble, tile etc.
- We no longer accept auto liquids/hazardous materials.
   These items are for our annual STOP Day
- All METAL and appliances, call (631) 669-4878, no later than Thursday, for Friday pick-up

There is no garbage collection or recycling of any kind on weekends and holidays. When rubbish or recycling collection falls on a holiday, please do not put items out for pickup until your next regularly scheduled pickup.
